PMC celebrated with a **full week** of programs!



Tuesday at Jules E. Mastbaum High School

PMC went into a 12th grade class of 15 students at **Jules E. Mastbaum High School** to teach a class about the
Pennsylvania court system, judicial selection, and civic
duty. Students participated in a mock judicial election and
learned about their responsibility to participate in our
democracy,



Wednesday at SS. Cyril & Philomena

PMC taught a class of 7th graders at **SS. Cyril and Philomena** about Free Speech in Schools. Students learned the limits and protections of the First Amendment and debated whether hypothetical scenarios abridge our right, such as a student criticizing the principal on social media while off campus and a law banning violent video games from being sold to children.



Wednesday at Furness High School

PMC visited 25 students who run Youth Court at **Furness High School**. Students received training on PMC's Bail Watch program and learned the unique bail system in Philadelphia. Students discussed the court system, the criminal justice system and arraignments.



Thursday at the Courthouse

PMC took Furness High School Youth Court students to the Juanita Kidd Stout Center for Criminal Justice in downtown Philadelphia. Students observed preliminary arraignments alongside state legislators and city council members, a preliminary hearing which featured FaceTime video evidence, and discussed the similarities and differences of their program.



Friday at William McKinley Elementary School

PMC held a career day panel for 75 6th, 7th, and 8th graders at **William McKinley Elementary School.** The panel was comprised of a federal judge, lawyers, PMC team members, and a college student. Students learned about different career pathways in the legal field along with fun facts about the courts, the Pennsylvania constitution, and the history of Pennsylvania.
